Friends in Christ,

It is my hope and my prayer that you were richly blessed this Christmas season, and that the arrival of a New Year was a time of hope and celebration of all that God has done and will do. For me, January is often a time of looking forward at what is to come and making preparations. While it feels like our trip to Houston with Zion's youth for the 2018 ELCA National Youth Gathering was just a few months ago, it has actually been long enough that we are well into our plans for the trip to Minneapolis for the 2021 Gathering. The biggest difference we are facing with the trip to Minneapolis versus the trip to Houston is the potential of a group that is twice the size! I am so excited for even more youth to have this incredible and transformative experience together as people of faith. Gathered together with somewhere near 31,000 other Christians from around the country, we will worship, pray, sing, dance, and experience the work of the Spirit in our midst.

While a group that could easily be twice the size is exciting, it does bring challenges. The biggest being (perhaps some of you have already had the thought) the cost. Fundraising for this milestone event in our youth's life of faith is going to be the largest part of our preparations. And that means it is time for another Zion yard sale (or should we say Fellowship Hall sale?). You heard it here first, on Saturday, March 28th, our hope is to have the Fellowship Hall packed to the brim with all manner of treasures, bric-a-brac, and goodies to sell to our neighbors, friends, and even each other. So that means it is time to start saving stuff to donate!

Getting ready for a yard sale means seeing the stuff around us with a different set of eyes. What items that have been cast aside or forgotten might have value? What pieces might be transformed into a resource for the formation of our youth's faith? We have to take a moment to see things creatively and put aside our initial assessment or reaction.

This is the way that God sees us, and the way He sees the world. In us He sees potential and value worth the life of the Son. Where the world may see a lost cause or one beyond redemption, God sees a precious child with the potential for radical transformation.

We are all caught up in a process of daily transformation. Each and every moment there are opportunities for us to become even more deeply aware of the presence of God and to be caught up in it. However, most of us can pinpoint a few milestone events in our life of faith that had a huge impact. Experiences that absolutely changed us in dramatic and profound ways. For the forgotten dishes or jewelry or electronics you will donate for our Zion yard sale, the moment they are set out on the tables to be sold will bring about a real transformation; perhaps from 'trash' to 'treasure'. For many throughout the country and even here at Zion, an ELCA Youth Gathering has been an experience that has deeply transformed and changed them. I continue to hear from our youth who went in 2018 what an important impact it made on them.

More information will be coming out on our Zion Spring yard sale soon (the morning of Saturday, March 28th for those who like to mark calendars), but in the meantime we are asking for everyone to begin to start taking a look around for items that you may be able and willing to donate to be sold. All funds raised will go directly to sending our youth to Minneapolis for the 2021 ELCA National Youth Gathering. As you pause to see the potential and value in the stuff around you, remember that is how God sees the world; full of potential and value. I encourage you to continue to learn to see the world and the people in it as God sees them.


While we can offer to store items from now until the sale, we are asking that those who are able store their items until the week of March 22nd when they should be brought to the church (remember that the office is closed on


