One of the small joys of pastoral leadership is observing the many quality relationships that take place in the hallways, fellowship hall, and pews of the church. Every week as I walk around the building before and after the services I hear these conversations and see these connections. We are companions (literally those who break bread together) in faith and as the Body of Christ we rely on each other especially when we experience hardship. As the church we offer mutual consolation to one another.

On his lectures on Genesis, Martin Luther testified to the importance of friendship and consolation:

When Christ was wrestling with temptation in the garden (Matt. 26:37), we see Him seeking comfort among His three disciples. When Paul, in Acts 28:15, saw the brethren coming to meet him, he took courage from the sight and experienced comfort. Loneliness distresses a person who is solitary and deprived of his intimate friends. He can exert himself and struggle against it, but he does not overcome it without great difficulty.

Everything is less burdensome if you have a brother with you; for then the promise applies (Matt. 18:20): "Where two or three are gathered in My name, there am I in the midst of them." Therefore, solitude should be shunned and the companionship of familiar people sought, especially in spiritual peril.

The Holy Spirit grounds us in our ability to support each other as we exist in community. Each of us are equipped for the work of mutual support within this family of Christ.

However, the closeness of a family like church does come with its own challenges. Perhaps the largest challenge is expanding the family and welcoming newcomers. Every weekend we have visitors, meaning that every weekend we have the opportunity to extend a warm welcome and the invitation to participate in this community of faith.

Here are some things to keep in mind to help newcomers land smoothly:

- Offer directions to the sanctuary, restrooms, and fellowship hall. Zion's building can be confusing for first, second, or even tenth time visitors.
- Engage with people you do not recognize before and after the worship services. A warm greeting can go a long way to making people feel at home in a new environment.
- Remember that stories build connection. Don't be afraid to ask open ended questions to someone you've just met to fuel conversation.
- Invite a newer person to smaller groups that exist in the congregation, especially ones that you are familiar with. In smaller settings it is easier for people to experience relational connection.

I pray that we will continue to take care of each other's needs and hardships as a community of faith. I also pray that we will continue to be welcoming and inclusive of those who are newer in our Zion family.
