I struggle to find adequate words as I reflect on these past twelve months. We spent a whole year living in the shifting stresses of a pandemic, donning masks, and being disappointed and unfulfilled as many of the routines and activities we took for granted were stripped away. It is easy to feel like this has been a lost year and wallow in self-pity. In response to that mindset theologian Diana Butler Bass writes, "You haven't lost a year of your life to COVID. You've invested a year of your life in saving the lives of your family, friends, neighbors, and strangers."

Last year's COVID lockdown occurred in Lent and in many respects it feels like Lent never left us. Lent is a season of somberness and solemnity as we reflect on our baptism and its foundation in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is a time for rebirth and renewal in preparation for the Easter celebration. In 2020 Easter came and went, and although we celebrated virtually, the veil of COVID still covered us like purple fabric draped over the cross.

This year an Easter spirit has crept into our Lenten observance. That feeling may be due to the spring flowers rising from the soil, or the longer days warming the earth, or the return of the birds' song...but I suspect that the true reason is the hope of new life spurred by our rising vaccination reports. To be clear, a vaccine is not our Savior, even if it saves us from the coronavirus. However, it is hard to create a better image of resurrected life than our community emerging beyond the pandemic's pall. We are living a modern parable of the Kingdom of God.

Although we do not know when masks will go away or when singing will return, although we do not know when the "new normal" will set in, we are confident that God's presence and promise will accompany us on the way. There are bound to be a few more disappointments and bumps in the road as the pandemic resolves, but resurrected life will come to us nonetheless. We are an Easter people. Let us praise God for the gift of renewed life.

# A Giving Opportunity

#### Qualified Charitable Distributions

Are you aware of the tax benefits of this giving opportunity?

As men and women approach their  $72^{nd}$  birthdays, their financial advisor or tax preparer should make them aware that they are required by federal law to make an annual **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) from all of their retirement accounts – <u>whether they need the money or not</u>.

That RMD is about four percent of a person's IRA and as you would expect, federal tax must be paid on that amount. Most financial planners take care of remitting the tax for you at the time the RMD is made.

#### Did you know there is a way to avoid paying Federal Income Tax on a portion, or even the entire amount, of your RMD and support the ministries of Zion Lutheran Church at the same time?

Federal law provides an opportunity to make a **Qualified Charitable Distribution** (QCD) when your annual distribution is required. A QCD is a tax-free donation that can be paid directly from your IRA to Zion Lutheran Church, a recognized 501 (c)(3) organization.

The maximum annual exclusion for this Qualified Charitable Donation is \$100,000. *Please remember that this QCD must be paid directly from your IRA to the church*. Your financial advisor can assist with this process.

We are so excited to offer a family retreat this Spring at Sequanota! Attendees will stay in the comfortable Bowersox Center ("hotel style" private rooms and bath-


rooms) as we play games, worship around a campfire, enjoy the outdoors, and more. Families (or individuals), sign up today. Space is limited!
