Renew, Restore, and Rejuvenate: A Zion Capital Stewardship Campaign

As a young teenager the change came as a surprise; we were worshipping in the Fellowship Hall. I'm quite positive that Pastors Scott and Carol Custead and members of Zion's leadership teams announced all the plans and phases and disruptions that the congregation would face, but at the age of 13 you only half-hear anything, even if you're in church every week. The routine of climbing the stairs and sitting in the pews was replaced by a sea of folding chairs all oriented to a makeshift altar. The building was under construction and the people of Zion would be worshipping here for the time being while anticipating the changes to the rest of the building.

The New Century Capital Campaign was expansive. The majority of Zion was updated and changed: the sanctuary carpet and paint scheme, the stained-glass windows were cleaned, the first floor was reconfigured, dividing walls added to the Fellowship Hall, landscaping outside...and that's just what I remember! However, the New Century Campaign occurred at the turn of the century, over two decades ago, and the time has come to replace and update Zion once again.

The Renew, Restore, and Rejuvenate Campaign aims to rehabilitate the tired and worn parts of our building and will allow for the completion of the following projects:

- Replace our 50-year-old elevator
- Painting of the sanctuary and plaster repair
- Replace of the carpet in the sanctuary
- Complete renovation of six rest rooms
- Complete renovation of the church kitchen
- Replace the flooring in the narthex

To complete these renovations our church needs to raise \$350,000 over the next three years. These funds are in addition to the regular financial offerings given for the day-to-day ministry of our congregation. The pandemic has delayed the start to the campaign and the Capital Campaign Committee is eager to begin its work in the very near future. Please keep a lookout for more information on our upcoming endeavor.

In the near future we will find ourselves again worshipping in the Fellowship Hall, wondering what the unveiling of our new sanctuary space will look like. Soon we will have the wonderful chaos of construction and renovation. It is my hope that we will effortlessly meet our goals and complete these projects to make Zion a more welcoming building and house of worship.

A Giving Opportunity

<u>Qualified Charitable Distributions</u> Are you aware of the tax benefits of this giving opportunity?

As men and women approach their 72_{nd} birthdays, their financial advisor or tax preparer should make them aware that they are required by federal law to make an annual **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) from all of their retirement accounts – whether they need the money or not.

That RMD is about four percent of a person's IRA and as you would expect, federal tax must be paid on that amount. Most financial planners take care of remitting the tax for you at the time the RMD is made.

Did you know there is a way to avoid paying Federal Income Tax on a portion, or even the entire amount, of your RMD and support the ministries of Zion Lutheran Church at the same time?

Federal law provides an opportunity to make a **Quali** -fied Charitable Distribution (QCD) when your annual distribution is required. A QCD is a tax-free donation that can be paid directly from your IRA to Zion Lutheran Church, a recognized 501 (c)(3) organization.

The maximum annual exclusion for this Qualified Charitable Donation is \$100,000. *Please remember that this QCD must be paid directly from your IRA to the church*. Your financial advisor can assist with this process.
