I watch a lot of science fiction television series and movies; many set in the future. In lots of these stories there is that cliché moment when a character emerges from a shelter or the underground after some massively destructive event. While this is not the direction I was hoping to go, I am left looking for "what's left" after a moment of destruction.

At first, it was hard to believe that anything could be left standing after this. As the dust settled, I quickly realized just how much was left! Three amazing children to teach and love, a faith that continues to sustain, family and friendships to be rekindled, a beautiful town to live and work in, the gift of art and music that is the color in my life, collegial relationships and friendships, the written word to sharpen thought, enjoying the outdoors with Mom, deep discussions with Dad, a congregation to do ministry with that values and cares for me, and young people to lead in the ways of Jesus. Not only am I considering what is left standing, but what can be built. I am looking to build a new "house on rock", and I am grateful that Zion is a part of it.

I want to thank all of you who have helped me during this time. I have been surrounded by love and support, and it is deeply appreciated. Reality is, there are many of you I would have preferred to share this news with face to face, but there have been many to tell. I ask for understanding from those of you who are learning of it here. Please do not hesitate to speak with me, or ask me any questions. We have so many good things standing here at Zion to be grateful for. It was announced in early July that Zion's capital campaign goal of \$350,000 had been surpassed!




Information about pledge payments and remittance envelopes was mailed to the homes of all capital campaign


