Friends in Christ,

Tired, frustrated, angry, disappointed, afraid, worried; emotions we are all too familiar with these days. There is no sense in avoiding it. Everyone has had plenty to feel this way about since March of 2020. We grow tired of being told and telling others to remain optimistic and to be patient. The pandemic has shaken the very core of our community and life. Its impact reaches into almost everything from schools to family to work to church. We are also no strangers to division and disagreement. Working together has been difficult as we balance and react to two very real dangers: 1. Covid-19 and 2. Negative consequences of limiting our social life together. Both of these dangers carry long lasting and far reaching ramifications. The extent to which we feel each one depends on our circumstances. I encourage us to listen to each other and continue to take both dangers seriously as we work together. I have felt the weight of these realities in my personal and professional life, just as many of you have.

We become so accustomed to our blessings in life. This is a tragic reality that we all contend with; the tendency to "get used" to the good stuff. How easy it is to be so weighed down with our challenges that we become blind to our gifts. Through work with the Salvation Army, I once met a man who lived on the streets of Philadelphia for about 10 years. He shared with me that the key to his health and wellness was to hold on to what it felt like to sleep in a real bed for the first time in a decade. His prayer every night was to never forget this precious gift that many take for granted. I wonder how many times in the last 20 months have I failed to fully appreciate the gift of my children's voices, a smile on my wife's face, a warm home, or God's Word at my fingertips? Recently, I had the chance to dip my hands into water and remind our youth of God's enduring claim on them in their baptisms. What an incredible opportunity and gift, particularly in these times. God got my attention that evening and reminded me not only of my own baptism, but of all His promises that will be kept no matter what. May we be given eyes to see Him at work in all times and places this year.

These days, there is a lot that I feel like I don't know. However, there are some things I do know. The Name of Jesus Christ brings healing and restoration to lives broken by sin and darkness. Hearts will be renewed this year. Children will grow to know the One who loves them. Mouths will be fed in the name of our Lord who will one day satisfy all hunger. God's justice will reign in communities divided by hate. People in pain will find comfort. The Holy Spirit will convict, guide, and inspire believers as they take on the work of the Gospel. God's name will be praised in word and deed. All of this will happen with us and in spite of us. This year, I challenge us all to grab tightly the gifts God gives and ready ourselves for Gospel work.



Yard Sale Donations and Help

The Zion Yard Sale is scheduled for Saturday, March 26th. We had lots of great donations collected in 2020 for the original yard sale date. Thank you to all who donated! For those who have been holding on to items or will have things to donate, **donations may be brought to the church from March 21st-March 25th**, **9:00am-3:00pm.** There will be signage to direct where to leave donations on the first floor. We ask that larger quantities be delivered earlier in the week, thank you! Unsold donations will be given to the Salvation Army for use in their thrift stores which raise funds for their Adult Rehabilitation Centers.

In advance of the 2022 Capital Campaign

Zion's Property Board tirelessly addresses a long list of projects

Property owners can attest to the fact that proactive upgrades and improvements cannot be ignored. Finding money to complete these projects saves money in the long run and lessens the chances of unexpected disasters and ongoing problems in the years ahead.

In recent years Zion's Property Board has done an amazing job to identify and complete projects that need addressed in both the church and the parsonage.

Zion's \$350,000 "Renew, Restore and Rejuvenate" capital campaign later this year will help complete six major projects that simply cannot be funded by the regular budget.

It's important for members of the Zion family to take a look at what has been tackled in recent years. Most of these projects have been finished without much fanfare. Few of them would be considered "glamorous" - *but each was vitally important*.

- A \$6,000 upgrade to the fire alarm system will assist first responders should an emergency arise.
- An \$8,000 wireless microphone update in the sanctuary was necessary to make the system compliant with FCC regulations.
- Zion's WiFi was improved to allow for additional "traffic" and give a stronger signal throughout the church. This was a modest \$500 expenditure.
- Have you noticed the new ADA-compliant restroom on the first floor? Rather than renovating one of Zion's existing restrooms for people with disabilities, the Property Board decided to construct a new one at a cost of \$14,000.
- A tripping hazard was identified when the old carpet on the first floor began to "bubble" as the glue lifted. A sum of \$20,000 was allocated to replace this tripping hazard and the walls were painted at the same time.
- Because the parsonage windows were old, wooden and single-pane glass, \$56,000 was allocated to replace them with double -pane fiberglass windows creating a significant energy saving in both summer and winter. All of the trim, soffit and fascia were repainted to match.
- To protect part of this investment, \$400 was spent to install window wells and re-work the landscaping around the parsonage during a workday last spring.
- The flat roof on the parsonage was re-done after a problem was identified and a second-floor window was improved at a total cost of \$14,000. Another \$5,000 was earmarked to replace two dilapidated storage sheds with a new one.
- The roof of the fellowship hall has been leaking for many years. Recently, the Property Board allocated \$17,000 to have a new economical roofing product installed that did not require removal of the old material.
- A storage room that can be used by various Zion groups was constructed. In the process, the senior high room was walled off and a new mural was painted there. Total cost of this project was \$1,100.
- As the mortar and bricks along with the joints on Zion's slate steps were losing the battle with the elements, a sum of \$3,500 was earmarked for re-pointing and repair in that area.
- Another \$10,000 was spent to replace the old air conditioning unit in the nursery that had stopped working. The new unit will cool a larger area far-more efficiently.
- Lastly, \$15,000 was allocated to replace the Lexan material which protects Zion's beautiful stained glass windows. The old covers had been impossible to see through and due to a lack of ventilation were damaging the windows. This might have been the project that got the most notice from our members which led to rave reviews.

Offering Envelopes & Online Giving

2022 offering envelopes will be available mid-way through December. Please pick them up (and any you might be able to deliver to friends, neighbors and family) in the fellowship hall and discard any old ones. Using old envelopes may cause a discrepancy on your giving statement, so please do not use them.

Also a reminder that the church has online giving available for a more streamlined giving option. You can define how your money is distributed just like on your giving envelopes. If you are interested in online giving please contact the church office.

If you cannot find your envelope box or you are a newer member who has not received envelopes yet, please call the church office and we will make sure you receive them.



A Giving Opportunity

Qualified Charitable Distributions

Are you aware of the tax benefits of this giving opportunity?

As men and women approach their 72nd birthdays, their financial advisor or tax preparer should make them aware that they are required by federal law to make an annual Required Minimum Distri**bution** (RMD) from all of their retirement accounts – whether they need the money or not.

That RMD is about four percent of a person's IRA and as you would expect, federal tax must be paid on that amount. Most financial planners take care of remitting the tax for you at the time the RMD is made.

Did you know there is a way to avoid paying Federal Income Tax on a portion, or even the entire amount, of your RMD and support the ministries of Zion Lutheran Church at the same time?

Federal law provides an opportunity to make a Quali-fied Charitable Distribution (QCD) when your annual distribution is required. A QCD is a tax-free donation that can be paid directly from your IRA to Zion Lutheran Church, a recognized 501 (c)(3) organization.

The maximum annual exclusion for this Qualified Charitable Donation is \$100,000. *Please remember that this QCD must be paid* directly from your IRA to the church. Your financial advisor can assist with this process.
