The beauty of this autumn has been absolutely amazing. It has been a delight to look around at our ridges and valleys to witness the stunning array of color from our changing trees. But something else is happening as the days grow shorter and colder; nature is preparing for what's next.

Everywhere you look plants are producing seed that will give way to new life once the ice and snow have melted away this winter. On my wife's flower farm this is abundantly clear. I spent a few hours in October collecting celosia flowers and seed pods. These vividly colored plants had black specks bursting from



their flowers, ready to shower the ground with their future descendants. It was even more astonishing to me that I was collecting these seeds off of volunteer plants, dozens of celosias that seeded naturally in a flower bed that was supposed to be dormant this season.

Jesus uses the image of seed several times in the gospels as an aspect of our life of faith. My favorite instance comes in the parable of sower, where the farmer indiscriminately throws seed on all sorts of ground: good soil, rocky soil, weedy ground, and even the path. And the seed produced, especially in the good soil, yielding an abundant harvest. The celosia at the farm could just as easily be the sower, tossing seed everywhere and yielding all sorts of results.

If we are the sower with a bag full of seed (perhaps the seed is the good news of God or your faith), how is it that we spread and sow? Are you sowing with abandon? Are you sowing at all?

At the end of October I celebrated my 10th anniversary of ordination. Even though I'm still relatively young in this whole ministry business those ten years equate to more than 500 sermons written and countless hours spent discussing scripture and faith in Bible Studies, conversations, and classrooms. I've been chucking some seed! And yet, given all that sowing, sometimes it is hard to look and see results. Then again, all the celosia that scattered their seed last year didn't live to see the new generations take root.

Learn the lesson of the parable. Learn the lesson of the flowers. Learn the lesson of autumn. Sow, sow, and sow some more. Live a faithful life that showers the grace of God on all you meet, for God does the same for us.

Dear Brothers and Sisters at Zion,

As you probably know, Ryan Custead, Zion's director of faith formation and outreach, is going through a painful divorce. Adding to the pain and uncertainty in his life was the fact that he could not make ends meet on his salary. Ryan began reviewing his financial situation and comparing his salary to others in the area. While he cherishes and values his work here, his foremost concern is being able to provide for his children. With this on his heart, he approached the CPC in September and requested an increase to his salary.

After researching the fair-market rate for a Director of Faith Formation and Outreach in the region, the CPC decided that Ryan was underpaid. The CPC discussed at length various options on how best to correct the salary to meet the market rate, and at our October meeting, the CPC voted to increase Ryan's salary by \$3,000 annually.

This decision was difficult because, while we are blessed with a safety net of investment funds, Zion's revenue is not meeting our expenses this year. This is influenced no doubt by the economic climate and the drain on people's available funds by our Capital Campaign. Additionally, the church recently increased its expenditures on insurance as Ryan had previously been covered by his wife's insurance, and Kelsey, Pastor David's new wife, became eligible for coverage when they wed in September.

Despite these strains on our finances, I could not be more optimistic about the future of our Church. We are blessed with excellent leadership from Pastor David and Ryan. We are blessed with a generous congregation that resoundingly answered the call of a Capital Campaign in the midst of a pandemic and difficult economic period. We are blessed with the community of Hollidaysburg that needs Christ and needs us as his hands in the world. There is so much good that we can do, and I believe we are on the right path.

Our church will continue to grow and recover from the pandemic-era strangeness that plagued churches, schools, and virtually every other aspect of life across the nation. We have some hard choices about our financial priorities in the coming years, but together we will become stronger. As it says in Psalm 37:5, "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him, and he will act."

Please reach out to me or another CPC member if you have any questions or concerns. I know that this brief letter does not cover everything that you might wish to know, and the council wants to hear from you.

NOVEMBER UPDATE

- Zion members who contributed to our Capital Campaign in July, August and September received their first quarter report in early October. All campaign donations are being checked carefully so accuracy can be maintained. Please call the church office if you think you spotted a discrepancy.
- These quarterly reports will also help everyone monitor their pledge payments whether they are making weekly, monthly or annual payments over the next three years.
- As of the end of October, payments total \$224,533. This represents approximately 47 percent of the \$479,000 pledged.
- We continue to appreciate those who are clearly writing CAPITAL CAMPAIGN on their offering envelopes so these gifts can be recorded accurately. Feel free to use the campaign remittance envelopes that are being provided.
- We SINCERELY THANK everyone for maintaining their regular offerings to the General Fund while contributing to the Capital Campaign so Zion's ministries and activities can continue to move forward.
- During the past month, Eastern Elevator took final measurements so they can begin fabricating materials off-site for the new elevator. A representative of New Holland Church Furniture visited Zion to take final measurements for our new sanctuary pews.
- Zion's diligent Property Board has scheduled meetings in early December with all contractors involved in work to be done on the elevator, in the sanctuary and the narthex.
- Final worship services in the sanctuary will take place on the weekend of January 7-8. Weekly worship services will continue in the Fellowship Hall until all three projects are completed hopefully in 6-8 weeks.
