I know another family that, at one time, decorated the entire house during the few hours between Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. We all have our own versions of holiday baking, cards, gift exchanges, worship, carols, festive gatherings, and every other tradition that is unique to us—and all of these observances hold power and add to the richness of Christmas.

If traditions do instill power and meaning, which traditions of faith have you inherited or built that provide enrichment in your spiritual life? The church, especially the Lutheran church, has no shortage of practices that date back to antiquity and have been influential to an uncountable number of people. Which of these traditions provide meaning and memory for you?

With Christmas the traditions come easy. We have the benefit of nostalgia and holiday cheer. And while these positive associations have pushed the season earlier and earlier in the world's observance, Christmas traditions retain their special status because they are dedicated to a specific time of year. How do we maintain the wonder and love of the faith traditions that we observe week after week and day after day? Can we joyously celebrate the mundane? How much poorer would we be without the everyday traditions of the church?

Perhaps this is why Christianity often utilizes words like discipline and practice. While we do have exciting celebrations throughout the year, we also have all the ordinary days. Not every day, nor can every tradition, be as exciting as what we do at Christmas. And yet, these tried-and-true practices are what carry us through from one holiday to the next. So, as you honor your traditions this Christmas, think about which faith traditions sustain you and refresh you in your life of faith.

DECEMBER UPDATE

- Zion's Capital Campaign was launched last May 15. As of mid-November, payments total \$240,517. This represents approximately 50 percent of the \$479,000 pledged.
- We also SINCERELY THANK everyone for maintaining their regular offerings to the General Fund while contributing to the Capital Campaign so Zion's ministries and activities can continue to move forward.
- We continue to appreciate those who are clearly writing CAPITAL CAMPAIGN on their offering envelopes so these gifts can be recorded accurately. Feel free to use the campaign remittance envelopes that have been provided.
- Zion's Property Board is finalizing arrangements with all contractors so work can begin on the elevator, in the sanctuary and in the narthex in early January. More specific information will be shared in the January newsletter and worship bulletins.
- Final worship services in the sanctuary will take place on the weekend of January 7-8. Weekly worship services will continue in the Fellowship Hall until all three projects are completed hopefully in 6-8 weeks.
