The sun beats hard on the church during the summer months. The double wooden doors on Allegheny Street were taking a beating after years of weathering. The finish was cracking, blistering, and peeling. It was discolored. It would flake off under the slightest pressure. The doors looked bad—real bad—and many of you took notice.

Our contractor took the doors away. For weeks plywood covered the entrance and made some of the public wonder if our church had closed. However, when the doors returned and were reinstalled, they looked brand new. It was a complete transformation. The doors were now ready for a few more decades of welcoming people into the church. All it took was some sanding and stain and care for the doors to be renewed.

In this season of Easter I often ponder this theme of renewed and new life. It's everywhere in our selected scriptures for Sundays. We are well aware of the resurrected life Jesus receives on Easter Day. We are steeped in the baptismal promises that we will be raised to new life on the other side of the grave. How often do we explore the new life God gives to us now so that we may continue to live life and to live it abundantly?

The church doors took their abuse from sun, wind, and moisture. We take ours in disappointments and loss and unplanned trips to the emergency room. Doors are renewed with the right tools and a little elbow grease. How are we renewed by God?

Grace is God's duct tape. It is by God's grace that we are forgiven. It is by God's grace that we are healed. Through God's grace we receive love, acceptance, and second, third, fourth, and sixty-fifth chances. The grace of God, this gift that is freely given, is how we experience our renewed and resurrected lives both in this life and the next. Grace filled the empty tomb and it is the foundation of our Easter proclamation and promise.

This Easter Season, may your life be renewed where you need it most.
