Somehow we were left out of the loop. St Mary's, with whom we share half our the cemetery, terminated their contract with the company we both utilized to maintain the grass. The landscaping company then decided that only half of the cemetery was not a profitable venture and did not resume their cutting this spring. No one informed Zion of any of these decisions.

No one informed us...until an angry borough employee called the church office to let us know of the situation. Waist high grass, which had not been cut at all this year, grew around the headstones and rustled in the breeze. It looked terrible, especially when juxtaposed against the well-manicured lawn of St. Mary's Cemetery. It was certainly over the six inch grass restriction set by the borough.

With Memorial Day fast approaching and no time to hire a new company, a few members of Zion went to work. Shawn and Susan Restly, Gary Launtz, Mike Jones, Rick Fairhead, and I took on the task of taming the grass. As we worked, I was constantly amazed at the vigorous growth of the grass and other vegetation. Left to its own devices, with a little rain and a lot sun, nature took off.

In the church we are entering into the Season after Pentecost, which is also known as Ordinary Time. Sometimes this season tends to languish, because it is long, lasting almost half the year, and there are hardly any special celebrations in the church calendar. And yet, despite its commonplace nature, this time sports the color of green because it represents life, vitality, and growth.

Grass needs water and light to grow. What do we need to grow in our lives of faith?

Even though the Season after Pentecost is devoid of huge church holidays, it still maintains all the components we need to grow as people of God. In fact, each Sunday we will hear of a different gospel lesson that prompts the question, "What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus Christ?" These are stories of Jesus ministry that are designed to help us experience a more robust faith. On top of the readings, we also have ample time as the church to continue in our spirituality, community, care, and service with one another. Through practice and worship we grow together.

Of course, we don't grow wild. That's the beauty and wisdom of existing together as church. We support, guide, and often check each other as the Body of Christ to ensure that our growth is in a positive direction, and not following some passing fad or dangerous trend that feels good at the time. Our growth comes with purpose, for we have been planted and cultivated by God.



AFTERBURNER VOLUNTEERS!

As we look to the Fall and the return of our Afterburner youth ministry, our first job is to be

sure we have enough adult volunteers to serve as chaperones. We need to have about 18 volunteer chaperones each time to safely hold Afterburners. Please prayerfully consider if this is a commitment you can make. We anticipate increased attendance AND have SIX Afterburners this year, so it is "all hands on deck". Chaperones are primarily a set of eves and remain available to respond as needed in the building. This is a wonderful opportunity to be a part of caring for our community's youth.

Responding that you are willing to volunteer as a chaperone does not indicate an absolute commitment at this point to chaperone every Afterburner. However, those who respond in the affirmative are stating that they would intend to chaperone a majority of Afterburners.

Zion Afterburners are events held after home HAHS Varsity Football games for all 7th-12th Graders in the community. This has been a service that Zion has provided for our community by creating a safe and fun environment for local youth to gather on Friday evenings in the Fall. Chaperones are posted at various places inside and outside the church for the safety of the youth. Chaperones generally serve from about 8:30pm-11:10pm. About 100 youth attended each Afterburners in 2022.

Capital Campaign Renovation Update

To date, campaign contributions have reached \$306,500. With Phase One expenses at just under \$275,000, we have roughly \$31,500 in the bank, allocated so far for Phase Two. Your continued support is greatly appreciated, as planning is underway for the kitchen remodel, but renovations will not begin until we are in a financially sound position to do so. Desired appliances for the kitchen upgrade have been specified, and final kitchen design is underway so the Property Board should have a proposed budget soon.


