



I was watching the news one night & caught an ad from the Jaffa Mosque about hosting a two day job fair so I sent that info to our dad who was unemployed at the time. He was able to have 4 interviews & two follow up. Our dad is now fully employed. Thank you Jaffa members.

Our outreach board has made a connection with the ARW food distribution center in Hollidaysburg. Our members are now making meals for the Hope drop in center located in Altoona & one of our committee members is taking a meal over to the BOH family. Thank you out reach members for your efforts in the kitchen.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE



The Capital Campaign total has reached \$373,229! The total includes all donations through January 16, 2024. With Phase I expenditures of approximately

\$275,000 deducted, there is now about \$98,229 available for Phase II.

Phase II is a complete renovation of the Kitchen, plus repairs and updates to the Men's and Woman's restrooms on the first floor. Phase III entails renovations to restrooms in the basement and on the 2 nd floor. It's a lot, so the Property Board is still in the process of researching options and working every angle to make sure every dollar is well allocated.


