For Christians, Easter is what it's all about. It's the pinnacle of our faith. Consider what St. Paul writes in his first letter to the Corinthians: "But if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain, and your faith is in vain (1 Cor. 15:14)." The fact of the matter is that death has always been, and will always be, a force that brings about seismic shifts in our lives. If that's the case for us mere mortals, imagine what it means for God to die on the cross. The crucifixion brought about a seismic shift for the entire cosmos and the resurrection brought about an entire new creation as God troubleshooted the problem of death.

900 years ago, an anonymous German succinctly captured the importance of the Easter mystery in a hymn we now call "Christ is Arisen." This hymn is a powerful little chant with the enormous ability to be a persistent earworm. Although it is short, the lyrics richly convey the importance of our celebration. Somehow, I've failed to ever incorporate this song during my ordained ministry, but that changes this Easter season. Expect to learn a new hymn this year!

Christ is arisen from the grave's dark prison. So let our joy rise full and free; Christ our comfort true will be, Alleluia!

Were Christ not arisen, then death were still our prison. Now, with him to life restored, we praise the Father of our Lord. Alleluia

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! So let our joy rise full and free; Christ our comfort true will be. Alleluia!

This Easter season may your joy rise full and free. May you find comfort is the resurrection promise of Christ. May all that brings about death and loss in your life find comfort in God's restoring promise.

There has been a price increase for 2024 with the new price being \$70. Our last price increase was in 2020. Checks can be made payable to Zion or you can include payment in your offering envelope by marking it "Altar Flowers". **Thank you** in advance for participating in this ministry.



The Capital Campaign donation total has reached \$405,000. With Phase I expenditures of approximately \$276,000 deducted, there is now about \$129,000 available for Phase II. Thank you for your continued support. Your donations are vital to accomplishing planned improvements. Thanks also to all the volunteers working toward making it all happen!

As mentioned in the previous update, the new kitchen will take on more of a commercial format, with stainless steel surfaces, a commercial dishwasher, commercial range, and more efficient restaurant-type storage and use options. The new specifications have been discussed with the Designer, and updated renderings are expected soon. Property Board also met with the Department of Agriculture to make sure plans meet the necessary requirements for a more commercial food prep space.

The kitchen is just part of Phase II. It also includes repairs and updates to the Men's and Woman's restrooms on the first floor. Phase III entails renovations to restrooms in the basement and on the 2nd floor. It's a lot, so the Property Board is working every angle to make sure every dollar is well allocated.
