I sit here and I ponder: If I cannot exercise discipline to not put my phone away at a decent hour, how on earth can I deny myself, take up my cross, and follow Christ as a disciple? The two points might seem far apart, but denying and following something other than our learned impulses is extremely difficult.

Thank God for the season of Lent, when we are invited to go beyond a simple New Year's Resolution redo and are encouraged to fast from something we may rely on a little too readily. We are not trying to be ascetic desert monks, giving up everything and living in a barren wasteland, but perhaps we can be a little less indulgent and a little more disciplined in how we follow Christ. I love having this yearly prompt, because, let's be honest, it's incredibly easy to hit the snooze button on faith.

CAPITAL **CAMPAIGN** UPDATE

The "bean counters" won't meet again until mid-March, but were able to provide a prelimi-

nary update. As of February 21st, the Capital Campaign donation total is a little over \$389,000. With Phase I expenditures of approximately \$276,000 deducted, there is now about \$113,000 available for Phase II. Thank you for your continued support. Your donations are vital to accomplishing planned improvements. Thanks also to all the volunteers working toward making it all happen!

The property board's collaborations have provided enough information, and the board is confident with the existing funds, for them to take the next step with the kitchen remodel. Specifications will be discussed with the contracted designer. There have been a lot of changes since the initial design conception. With the Serving Squad's increased use, and future plans, it has been decided that a more commercial kitchen will serve Zion best. This includes stainless steel surfaces, a commercial dishwasher, commercial range, and more efficient restauranttype storage and use options.

The kitchen is just part of Phase II. It also includes repairs and updates to the Men's and Woman's restrooms on the first floor. Phase III entails renovations to restrooms in the basement and on the 2^{nd} floor. It's a lot, so the Property Board is working every angle to make sure every dollar is well allocated.


