The national church body to which we belong, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, is developing a social statement on Civic Life and Faith. This document explores the relationship between church and state and was called for by the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2019.

Social statements are primary documents of the ELCA that address significant social issues. They are intended to aid reflection, shape conscience, and set forth the ELCA's teaching and policy on issues and questions of contemporary life. Social statements are developed by task forces, utilizing an established process of study and widespread participation across the church to guide our theological and moral deliberation.

Right now, we are invited, as members of the church, to study and give feedback on a draft version of the social statement. Surveys are available to give your voice to the process. Information can be found at <u>https://www.elca.org/civicsandfaith</u>. If you would like a copy of the information printed out for you, please visit the church office.

At Zion, the Allegheny Synod has asked us to host a hearing session on the draft social statement on Friday, June 14 at 5 PM. Dinner will be provided with the event. I would encourage you to read the draft material and come and participate in the conversation. Later in the evening, at 6 PM, we will also host the opening worship for the 2024 Allegheny Synod Assembly.

I hope you will take this opportunity to connect to the work of both our Synod and our Churchwide bodies. Our congregation is blessed to collaborate in ministry with these regional and national expressions of the church, and we are richer when we all work together.

### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

At the end of the Capital Campaign's  $7^{th}$  quarter, March  $31^{st}$ , the donation total reached \$407,270.

With Phase I expenditures of approximately \$276,000 deducted, there is now about \$131,270 available for Phase II. Thank you for your continued support. Your donations are vital to accomplishing planned improvements. Thanks also to all the volunteers working toward making it all happen!

As mentioned in the previous update, the new kitchen will take on more of a commercial format, with stainless steel surfaces, a commercial dishwasher, commercial range, and more efficient restaurant-type storage and use options. The new specifications have been discussed with the Designer, and updated renderings are expected soon. Considering the Outreach meal preparations for distribution, our occasional congregation meals/event, and anticipating the future of the Zion kitchen's use, Property Board reached out to the Department of Agriculture for additional information, and to determine if Zion's kitchen is required to be registered as commercial, as are other churches in the area. Findings will be presented and discussed with the CPC prior to plans proceeding.

The kitchen is just part of Phase II. It also includes repairs and updates to the Men's and Woman's restrooms on the first floor. Phase III entails renovations to restrooms in the basement and on the  $2^{nd}$  floor. It's a lot, so the Property Board is working every angle to make sure every dollar is well allocated.
