I'll be honest with you; God and I haven't been on the greatest of terms lately. Or perhaps it's more accurate to say that God has been perfectly fine in our relationship and I've been angry and disappointed. This confession shouldn't come as a shock given my family's medical experience and recovery this year. However, last month's introduction of Covid and pneumonia and the regression those illnesses brought was simply cruel.

I suspect my experience is one that most of you have had. We pray so hard and earnestly for situations that are dear to our hearts and it feels like our words are wasted breath falling on deaf ears. "God, where are you? I don't feel like I'm asking for too much here, can you give a little? Can you show your hand in action? How long, O Lord?" I'm beginning to intimately understand why the psalmists wrote phrases like "What profit is there in the death of your servant?" and "What praise can I give from the pit?"

This isn't a crisis of faith or a questioning of call. I still see God at work in this world, but just not in a few ways that would be impactful and meaningful for my family. It's tough to pray again and again for outcomes that never materialize. The lack of response starts to feel personal.

Through all of this, there is one way that I have repeatedly witnessed God at work. The work of care, concern, and compassion of our church has been a balm for my bruised and battered soul. We are the Body of Christ and often times this year I have clearly seen Christ in you. No, my prayers have not been answered in the ways I would like, but routinely the church has been an answer to those prayers.

Thank you for your witness. Thank you for the ways you bear Christ, not only to me, but to each other and all the world.

# PERSONAL CARE KITS (Lutheran World Relief - Kits of Care)

Ruth Circle is sponsoring the collection of Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief. As in past years, we are inviting the congregation to participate in contributing completed kits.

### ITEMS NEEDED FOR EACH KIT:

- 1. One light/medium weight bath size towel (dark color preferred)
- 2. Two bath size bars of soap (in original wrapping)
- 3. One metal nail clipper (remove packaging)
- 4. One toothbrush (in original package)(or if multi pack, put toothbrushes in a business size envelope and seal) (no plastic bags or wrap)
- 5. One sturdy comb (not in package)

# DO NOT ADD ADDITIONAL ITEMS OR LEAVE OUT ANY ITEMS LISTED.

Wrap items in the towel and tie securely with yarn. Do not enclose items in plastic bags. Bring completed kits to the church library by Sunday, October 27<sup>th</sup>.

Stitch & Sew is a group that comes together to make lap robes for local nursing home residents and quilts that are sent to Lutheran World Relief for use around the world.

<u>Financial donations are needed to keep this</u> <u>ministry active</u>. Money given helps to purchase fabric for the backing and the batting needed for the middle. Fabric donations are also welcomed. Only cotton based woven fabric can be used.

# ZION'S FOOD PANTRY

We are in need of donations to replenish Zion's food pantry! Your past generosity has enabled us to give assistance to quite a few members of our community, but the need is always there and our pantry shelves have been depleted.



We are asking for donations of boxed, prepackaged, & canned items. Ex. Soup, cereal, oatmeal/ cream of wheat, canned vegetables, canned/cups fruit, canned chicken or tuna, peanut butter, jelly, ramen, flavored rice or noodle packets, pasta, sauce, crackers, granola or cereal bars, applesauce, etc. Sometimes there is limited ability/supplies to prepare food so simple one-pot/nopot items can be helpful.

Other items that can be helpful are can openers, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, soap, razors, shaving cream, & feminine products.

Any items in excess of what we can use will be donated to the American Rescue Workers. Please do not donate expired food. Thank you in advance for your kindness!





# CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Zion's Capital Campaign contributions continue their

steady gain, with the total through August 14, 2024 now at \$446,557.

Congratulations to the Zion Family for their dedication and support! Deducting phase one expenses, there is now roughly \$170,000 available for the kitchen and bathroom remodels. (Some of this has already been spent on appliances and fixtures.)

Bathroom fixtures and kitchen appliances have been ordered. Some fixtures have arrived. Property board has 5 contractors interested in the remodel projects. 4 proposals have been submitted for kitchen cabinets. The property board, with guidance from the interior designer, plans to follow up with contractors in September.
