

The Advent Wreath is our most beloved and famous Advent symbol leading up to the Christmas season. Each week we light another candle and sing a verse of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" as we await the approaching nearness of our messiah, waiting for Christ to scatter the darkness.

This year I would like to introduce you to another wreath during this Advent season: The Wreath of Christ (sometimes called The Pearls of Christ). The Wreath of Christ is a prayer bead device developed by a Scandinavian Lutheran Bishop to assist people in their devotional lives. Think of it as a Lutheran Rosary with fewer beads.

Unlike the Rosary, there is considerable freedom in the way you can use and pray with the Wreath of Christ. There are no standard prayers to be memorized, rather each bead represents a specific theme to help you focus your devotions, like baptism, silence, or darkness.

This December, on Tuesdays the 3rd, 10th, and 17th, we will gather at 7 PM in the Fellowship Hall to learn about this prayer device. You will 3 have the opportunity to make your own Wreath of Christ to use and keep. Together, we will explore the themes of baptism, desert, silence, love, darkness, resurrection, and more. Following our time of study we will conclude in the sanctuary with a service of Holden Evening Prayer. The study and worship times will take about an hour and fifteen minutes.



I've used the Wreath of Christ as a prayer device for the past 14 years. It has been my favorite tool for devotion and I find myself returning to it again and again despite all host of other devotional options that exist. I encourage you to join us for our Advent practice.

ZION'S FOOD PANTRY

We are in need of donations to replenish Zion's food pantry. Your past generosity has enabled us to give assistance to quite a few members of our community, but the need is always there and our pantry shelves always need refilling.

We are asking for donations of boxed, pre-packaged, & canned items. Ex. Soup, cereal, oatmeal/cream of wheat, canned vegetables, canned/cups fruit, canned chicken or tuna, peanut butter, jelly, ramen, flavored rice or noodle packets, pasta, sauce, crackers, granola or cereal bars, applesauce, etc. Sometimes there is limited ability/supplies to prepare food so simple one-pot/no-pot items can be helpful.

Other items that can be helpful are can openers, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, soap, razors, shaving cream, & feminine products.

Our focus for the month will be canned meat, canned fruit, fruit cups, and can openers.





Offering Envelopes & Online Giving

ALTAR FLOWERS CHANGE

The Worship Board would like to remind the congregation of the sponsorship program for the flowers that are placed on the altar each week. There will be changes starting in 2025 to try to keep costs reasonable for sponsors and the church on weeks without a sponsor. The cost of altar flowers (2 vases) was scheduled to go up to \$100 for the coming year and that seemed excessive to ask of our congregation. The Worship Board has decided instead to go to one center arrangement which will cost \$65.00. This arrangement will be in a rectangular container approximately 9" x 4" and will sit between the candelabras. As always, you are welcome to sponsor the flowers in memory of loved ones, in honor of a special event, or in thanks for God's many blessings.

With the kitchen renovation starting, the bulletin board in the kitchen hall will not be accessible. If you are interested in signing up, **the sign-up sheet for the new year will be placed on the bulletin board outside the office door.** Also, when you sign up, be sure to mark the column stating if you want to take the flowers after services.

To summarize, the cost for **altar flowers for 2025 will be \$65.00 for one center arrangement.** Checks can be made payable to Zion or you can include payment in your offering envelope by marking it "Altar Flowers". **Thank you** in advance for participating in this ministry.



CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The Capital Campaign total has surpassed \$456,000, and it's looking like we'll be needing

every penny. Among other things, it has been discovered that a great deal of infrastructure; electrical and plumbing, has deteriorated beyond repair, and must be replaced.

Kitchen cabinet and pantry contents have been boxed up and are being stored in the side of the fellowship hall. A group of volunteers has been enlisted to finish temporary fellowship hall setup, and demo the kitchen on December 14. A few cabinets will be set aside to use for the new coffee bar. The remainder of the cabinets, appliances, sinks and countertops will be taken by members interested in "owning a piece of the kitchen". An architect will be finalizing drawings to be submitted for all required permitting. The asbestos abatement contractor will remove the tile floor during the first or second week of January. After that, the general contractor will dismantle the old kitchen ceiling and soffit and demo the bathrooms. This will be followed by electrical and plumbing upgrades throughout the entire remodel area and in the boiler room below. The process of installing the new ceiling, flooring and cabinets will become the first step of creating the new look of our kitchen and restrooms. Additional phases will follow. Stay tuned, and keep those pledges coming!
