Jesus said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it." ~Luke 9:23-24

Lent offers us a time to focus on discipline through spiritual practices. Historically that means prayer, fasting, alms giving, and good works. Sometimes we think of these spiritual practices as Christian New Year's Resolutions, as a focused time for self-betterment. We try to renew our self-control in the midst of an otherwise indulgent and abundant world that continuously assaults us.

Past self-control there is a more serious side of our Lenten discipline, one that's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die.

What are the ways in which we resist Jesus' taking the lead in our lives? Do we fight over who is in the driver's seat? Do we shy away from suffering or do we embrace it? Do we find ourselves practicing self-sacrifice or self-indulgence?

I love Eugene Peterson's paraphrases in his Message translation of the Bible: "What kind of deal is it to get everything you want but to lose yourself? What could you ever trade your soul for?"

As we close out our season of Lent, may the suffering and death of Jesus Christ continue to be foremost in our minds, and may we join with him in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ, and being resurrected to a new and purified life by shedding the un-Christ-like characteristics of our being.






or a financial setback can devastate one's self esteem. Family and personal struggles may leave them nowhere to turn for support.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Thank you for tolerating the dust and inconveniences as the first floor kitchen and bathroom renovations are underway, and moving along according to schedule. Let's keep our fingers crossed!

Volunteers took on the task of removing old fixtures and tile from the two first floor bathrooms, painting and prepping. Now the contractors take over upgrading plumbing, electric and installing new tile floors, walls.

Meanwhile, progress in the kitchen continues. New dish machine ductwork has been installed, and a new ceiling is going in. Next, the electric and plumbing will be upgraded then the floor will be coated in attractive, durable epoxy finish. Cabinets will be delivered soon, and staged for installation.

A collapsed drain pipe was discovered while preparing to replace the old, broken grease trap in the basement. So, the basement floor had to be dug up and re-cemented. This repair made new flooring a necessity. For efficiency, the same contractor doing the kitchen floor, will apply an attractive, durable, and easy-to-clean epoxy to the main hallway floors and stairwells throughout the basement. Expenses related repairs to the drain line collapse will be charged against the general building fund.

Capital Campaign donations have exceeded the pledged amount, and are now approaching the \$490,000 benchmark. The Zion community generosity is a blessing. Original cost estimates changed dramatically with the cost of materials and labor increases, unexpected expenses, and other variables. While it was not looking possible for a while, it will likely now be feasible to remodel the basement and second floor restrooms, as had been planned for Phase III.

Our continued thanks to all for making these much-needed updates to our beloved church possible. As we enter the Lenten Season; preparing spiritually for Easter, we can also look forward to the celebration of a fresh, new space for community and fellowship.
