In the small hallway next to our Sacristy there is a bronze tablet placed in memory of the Reverend Erias Unangst, a Lutheran missionary to India between the years 1857 and 1895. I suspect this plaque originally hung in the sanctuary and was moved to this out-of -the-way place when the Education Wing was added in the 1970s, but it reminds us of a remarkable man who spent a brief period of his life with us at Zion.

Rev. Unangst and his wife Phoebe were some of the earliest Lutheran missionaries to India. During his 38 years abroad, he translated parts of the Bible and many hymns and devotionals into Telegu. This ancient subcontinent language is largely considered one of the most difficult languages to learn, and yet he took the effort to learn and utilize it for ministry. Rev. Unangst gave a lifetime of service to the people of India. Tragically, Phoebe gave her life in this service too, dying in a cholera outbreak in 1888.

Rev. Unangst came to Hollidaysburg after his time in ministry, spending his waning years with his daughter, Mrs. W. I. Woodcock (unfortunately the 1953 history of Zion often identifies women through their husbands, so I do not have a first name for her!). On Dec 27, 1901 he became a member of the church and participated faithfully until his death.

Shortly after his death, The Unangst Missionary Society began at Zion. This was a young women's ministry of the church with the aim to study conditions and needs of the Lutheran mission field and to support that work through prayer and gifts. This organization was still functioning at Zion into the 1950s.

Given that Rev. Unangst liked to travel as a missionary, coupled with the fact that we are entering into the traveling season of summer, I thought you could take Rev. Unangst with you around the world. You've probably heard of Flat Stanley...I now present flat Rev. Unangst. A cardstock version of him is available in the office. Snap a picture with him as you travel and email your photo to news@zionhollidaysburg.org. We'll post the pictures on our bulletin board this summer to see the new places where Rev. Unangst traveled to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ.



Zion Family Camp is back for the summer of 2025! All are invited to take some time to be together in the beauty of Camp Sequanota and grow in faith. Attendees will stay in the comfortable Bowersox Center ("hotel style" private rooms and bathrooms) as we play games, worship around a campfire, enjoy the outdoors, and much more. Each day will include bible studies and morning activities for children/youth and adults, free time for hiking or swimming or relaxing alone, campfire worship, and fun group games in the evenings. We will also have the opportunity to go canoeing and use the camp's climbing tower and zipline. Families (or individuals), join us! Space is limited! Arrival and "move in" time at Sequanota is Friday evening from 7:00-8:00pm, and we finish together in the late morning on Tuesday.

Zion Mission Trip *Ocean City, Maryland* Environmental service work, feeding ministries, out-

reach, and more! Monday, July 14th - Sunday, July 20th

Who? All ages and family shapes are welcome! Youth, entering 7th Grade and older, are welcome on their own. Children, preschool-6th Grade are welcome with family or a grown up partner.

What? We will spend our days doing a variety of service work projects with local organizations and ministries. Projects will range from environmental work with the Maryland Coastal Bays Program, homeless outreach with Diakonia (local organization), work with our host congregation, St. Peter's Lutheran Church, and more. We will finish our work days with recreation time together on the beach! Evenings will be spent in fellowship along with prayer and devotion. Meals will be provided and served in the Retreat Center.

Where? Participants will have the option of staying with the group in the Son and Sand Retreat Center (St. Peter's Lutheran Church, 10301 Coastal Hwy, Ocean City, MD) or making their own arrangements for staying in Ocean City, joining the group for projects, meals, and fellowship. The retreat center has a full kitchen, community area, multiple rooms with bunk beds, and shower facilities. Those staying in the retreat center will share rooms as needed. *Youth (7th Grade and up) who are attending without a grown up must stay in the retreat center.

When? Our group will leave together the morning of Monday, July 14th and return late on Sunday, July 20th. We will travel in the church van along with other vehicles as needed. Participants are welcome to attend for a portion of the trip as their schedule allows.

AFTERBURNER **VOLUNTEERS!**

As we look to the Fall and the return of our After-

burner youth ministry, our first job is to be sure we have enough adult volunteers to serve as chaperones. We need to have about 18 volunteer chaperones each time to safely hold Afterburners. Please prayerfully consider if this is a commitment you can make. We anticipate increased attendance, so it is "all hands on deck". Chaperones are primarily a set of eves and remain available to respond as needed in the building. This is a wonderful opportunity to be a part of caring for our community's youth.

Responding that you are willing to volunteer as a chaperone does not indicate an absolute commitment at this point to chaperone every Afterburner. However, those who respond in the affirmative are stating that they would intend to chaperone a majority of Afterburners.

Zion Afterburners are events held after home HAHS Varsity Football games for all 7th-12th Graders in the community. This has been a service that Zion has provided for our community by creating a safe and fun environment for local youth to gather on Friday evenings in the Fall. Chaperones are posted at various places inside and outside the church for the safety of the youth. Chaperones generally serve from about 8:30pm-11:10pm. About 170 youth attended each Afterburners in 2024.
