10/12: Oktoberfest 10/19: Harvest Home 10/24: Afterburner The other day, my dog, Otto, had surgery to remove a cyst that was on his eyelid. He's doing well; everything went according to plan and only one stitch was required. However, with that one stitch came the infamous "cone of shame."

The cone of shame has brought a fair amount of amusement into the parsonage, much to Otto's chagrin. Door jams, cabinets, furniture, and legs are now, suddenly, in his way. He is ricocheting off obstacles faster than a plinko chip on the Price Is Right. Each collision is accompanied by the dull and hollow "thunk" of plastic. Otto does not understand, nor is he making any attempt to adjust his trajectory as he navigates through space.

This cone, Otto's inability to adjust and adapt, and the chaotic symphony of "thunks" is a perfect metaphor for sin. Quite often, our sinfulness is something we choose to do—decisions that we are aware of. At other times our complacency and inaction are our sinful behavior, leading to relationship rifts between others and God. It's as if we are wearing the cone and are unable to fully interact with the people and world around us. Instead, we collide and "thunk" and are oblivious to the ways in which we are making harmful contact with what surrounds us. Perhaps we are aware, and we simply don't wish to change course. We grow used to the "thunks" and even grow to find them amusing.

In this metaphor, God is the one who removes the cone of shame. Perhaps, this happens once we realize it is there and repent. Perhaps, this happens as an act of sheer gift from God, even in our obliviousness. This gift is forgiveness. This gift is grace. This gift is mercy. The removal of our cones allows us to fully engage with the world as God intends.

The next time you find yourself colliding with others, either intentionally or unintentionally, think of how you might be wearing a cone. What's preventing you from fully engaging? What's keeping you at arms' length? How often do you hear a "thunk?" In what way can you seek God's forgiveness if your actions or inactions are creating a rift?

Ruth Circle is sponsoring the collection of Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief. As in past years, we are inviting the congregation to participate in contributing completed kits.

#### ITEMS NEEDED FOR EACH KIT:

- 1. One light/medium weight bath size towel (dark color preferred)
- 2. Two bath size bars of soap (in original wrapping)
- 3. One metal nail clipper (remove packaging)
- 4. One toothbrush (in original package)(or if multi pack, put toothbrushes in a business size envelope and seal) (no plastic bags or wrap)
- 5. One sturdy comb (not in package)

### DO NOT ADD ADDITIONAL ITEMS OR LEAVE OUT ANY ITEMS LISTED.

Wrap items in the towel and tie securely with yarn. Do not enclose items in plastic bags. Bring completed kits to the church library by Sunday, October 26<sup>th</sup>.


