Need space? The service can be heard in the Chapel on the first floor.



If you cannot find your envelope box or you are a newer or prospective member who has not received envelopes yet, please call the church office and we will make sure you receive them.


A Brief Explanation of the Sections on your Giving Envelopes

<u>Current Expenses</u>: All money stated in the Current Expenses section of your envelope will be applied towards the operation of the church. These expenses are paid based on the budget that is voted on and approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting. This money is intended to offset all budgeted expenses. (See Financial Report below)

Benevolences: All money stated in the Benevolences section of your envelope will be forwarded to the Allegheny Synod, the ELCA, and beyond.

Special: All money in this section should be designated by the giver to a specific fund. (i.e. Building, Lutheran World Relief, Faith Riders, Stitch & Sew, National Youth Gathering, Helping Hand, Mission Trips, Youth Activities, etc.) These funds will be held for future use when needed. If you do not define a fund when you complete this section of your envelope, the money goes into an "Undesignated Specials" fund and will be used towards a project or need approved by the CPC.

ZION'S FOOD PANTRY

We are in need of donations to replenish Zion's food pantry. Your past generosity has enabled us to give assistance to quite a few members of our community, but the need is always there and our pantry shelves always need refilling.

We are asking for donations of boxed, pre-packaged, & canned items. Ex. Soup, cereal, oatmeal/cream of wheat, canned vegetables, canned/cups fruit, canned chicken or tuna, peanut butter, jelly, ramen, flavored rice or noodle packets, pasta, sauce, crackers, granola or cereal bars, applesauce, etc. Sometimes there is limited ability/supplies to prepare food so simple one-pot/no-pot items can be helpful.

Other items that can be helpful are can openers, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, soap, razors, shaving cream, & feminine products.

Any items in excess of what we can use will be donated to the American Rescue Workers. Please do not donate expired food. Thank you in advance for your kindness!

STITCH & SEW

Stitch & Sew is a group that comes together to make lap robes for local nursing home residents and quilts that are sent to Lutheran World Relief for use around the world.

Financial donations are needed to keep this ministry active. Money given helps to purchase fabric for the backing and the batting needed for the middle. Fabric donations are also welcomed. Only cotton based woven fabric can be used.

You are always welcome to join them on Wednesday mornings at 9:00 in the fellowship hall. All that is needed is a willing heart, and a desire to fellowship, and a bag lunch. Their day usually ends around 2:00. If you can only be there for part of the time—just come as you can.
