If you've been through the church building on a Saturday morning in the last couple of years, you may have bumped into some folks coming in and out of a meeting in the church chapel. "The Day After" meeting of the local Alcoholics Anonymous District meets every Saturday in our chapel at 8:30am. Since starting a couple of years ago, this meeting has become a well attended and foundational part of the local recovery community. It is attended by many people with decades of sobriety and life in recovery. The meeting is highly recommended, particularly for "new comers" looking to form new and supportive relationships. If you come across these folks in the church building, you will likely be warmly greeted. As always, AA asks that we keep to ourselves the names of those we come across. The "long timers" who started and run the meeting at Zion have extended a sincere thanks to our congregation for supporting and hosting them.

The men and women of AA who gather in our building each week come for connection, encouragement, and wisdom. Their meeting begins with a reading of "The Twelve Steps" and readings from the "Big Book" of Alcoholics Anonymous. These readings serve as a reminder of the collective wisdom of AA that has served so many for generations. They orient the listener toward God and to their fellow AAs. Readings provide an opportunity for personal inventory and reflection. Meeting attenders then find encouragement as they share with each other about their successes and their common struggles. It is often said, if you listen long enough in AA meetings, you will hear your own story. You will find a spiritual companion in your journey of recovery. Life in addiction is a life of isolation and profound "aloneness". Life in recovery is one of deep connection. AAs spend time in their meeting praying for each other, sharing and keeping up to date with challenges, victories, and changes.

This month, be reminded that we, the people of Zion, also gather in our church for the same; wisdom, encouragement, and connection. Our reading of scripture and the speaking of our confessions and creeds provide our opportunity for self reflection and are a fount of wisdom. They are old, old words that have captured the hearts of countless sisters and brothers throughout generations. We are reminded of holy promises and find Christ himself in story and prayer. We find encouragement from each other as we share in the trials and joys of life. Are you taking time to intentionally encourage your siblings at Zion? It is a gift we can offer and receive. Finally, we find connection at church; connection to each other and connection to God. How might you find even more connection at Zion? Attending small groups and bible studies or coming for special fellowship events are great ways to find connection. When you come to church, it is your role to both give and receive that which you seek; wisdom, encouragement, and connection. Thanks be to God!




TAIZÉ TUESDAY PROGRAM



Offering Envelopes & Online Giving

2026 offering envelopes are available in the Fellowship Hall. Please pick them up (and any you might be able to deliver to friends, neighbors and family) in the fellowship hall and **discard any old ones**. Using old envelopes may cause a discrepancy on your giving statement, so please do not use them.

Also a reminder that **the church has online giving available** for a more streamlined giving option. You can define how your money is distributed just like on your giving envelopes. Please consider this giving option as it allows for more consistent income flow to the church. If you are interested in online giving please contact the church office.

If you cannot find your envelope box or you are a new or prospective member who has not received envelopes yet, please call the church office and we will make sure you receive them.

A Brief Explanation of the Sections on your Giving Envelopes

Current Expenses: All money stated in the Current Expenses section of your envelope will be applied towards the operation of the church. These expenses are paid based on the budget that is voted on and approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting. This money is intended to offset all budgeted expenses. (See Financial Report below)

Benevolences: All money stated in the Benevolences section of your envelope will be forwarded to the Allegheny Synod, the ELCA, and beyond.

Special: All money in this section should be designated by the giver to a specific fund. (i.e. Building, Lutheran World Relief, Faith Riders, Stitch & Sew, National Youth Gathering, Helping Hand, Mission Trips, Youth Activities, etc.) These funds will be held for future use when needed. If you do not define a fund when you complete this section of your envelope, the money goes into an "Undesignated Specials" fund and will be used towards a project or need approved by the CPC.

Capital Campaign Final Tally



As the Zion Accountants close the books on the three-year capital campaign, a huge congratulations and thank you goes out to our congregation for its astounding success! The final tally is \$511,898.91.

For the final project, volunteers completed demo of the basement restrooms, painted the walls, and installed new ceiling tiles. Ceramic wall and floor tile will be installed over the coming weeks by a contractor. The new stall partitions, plumbing and new fixtures will follow. Completion is expected by mid-March.

It is projected that there will be a small surplus of funds, which will be rolled into the building fund. Most certainly the congregational generosity and love of Zion are unbelievable! The members seem to be enjoying the many improvements and upgrades made to the church building. The benefits of the congregation's efforts will be enjoyed for many years to come!
